
A Church is Built

Col. Copeland laid out the plan for the Roaring River church house. The church was built of large poplar logs and was in the shape of a cross. The house had twelve corners . . . a corner for each of the twelve Apostles. Roaring River was a United Baptist . . . or Hardshell Baptist and as the first charter member of the Stockton's Valley Association which was headquartered in Cumberland Valley, Kentucky

The Old Twelve Cornered Meetin' House is no more. All that is there to mark the spot is and overgrown graveyard. We do know that Stephen is buried there on the land where he labored and worshipped.
