## OUR ATKISON FAMILY

A brief record of the Atkison family as far back as I have been able to go at this date (June 8,1946)

Janes -----Slack-----Atkison

Harriet Janes was born in Loudoun County Virginia June 2,1815. As a young girl, she made a sampler from linen which had been raised on her father's farm. At the age of 15, she married in Virginia, the exact county I have not been able to locate the record but the County clerk there say it is not recorded in Loudoun County, but it may have been in adjoining Fauquiar Co.

We do know from other sources that it was Aug.1830 to Ephraim Slack born (1789) died (about May 2, 1836) He descended from an old New York or New Amsterdam family the original spelling being Slecht. The Revolutionary ancestor (note: his male children and his nephews of age also served in the Revolutionary War) of this family was Abram Slack who served in Captain Henry Van Horne's Company of Militia who enlisted from Newtown, Bucks County Pennsylvania (note: Abram and his family lived on a farm along the Delaware River in Lower Makefield Township, Bucks County, PA They attended the Old Presbyterian Church in Newtown).

Later, he moved to Bedford County, Virginia. where he died. Harret and Ephraim Slack were the parents of three children, all sons, namely Abram, Henry and John. Abram and Henry were born in Loudoun Co., Virginia, and in the summer of 1835, moved to McMinn Co., and their son John was born Dec.1835.

It was only a few years that the young father, Ephraim Slack was drowned in a mill race near Athens,1enn, in McMinn County. The widow and her three sons lived with her husband's bachelor brother, Henry, in Tennessee.

Harriet (died May 9, 1879) and was buried at Starr, Ohio, Hocking County, Ohio. They were the parents of six children. three boys and three girls.

- 2. Nancy Atkison born (August 19, 1846, died February 6, 1926)
- 3, Margaret Atkison born May 1, 1848 died Mar. 4, 1892.
- 4. Exean Atkison born July 24, 1850 died Mar 4,1935.
- 5. Samuel Atkison born July 26, 1853 died April 13, 1920.
- 6. .Joseph Henry Atkison born Nov.ll, 1856 died Feb.14,1931.

They lived first in Vinton County but at an early date went to near Stsrr Ohio in Hocking County. They lived in Vinton County when their daughter Margaret was ,born and lived near Cadiz, which is the County seat of Harrison County when their youngest child and son Joseph Henry was born.

The father, Joseph Atkison, died before the birth of this son. So this proves that he must have died in or near Cadiz and is probably buried there. Viola Morgan of Van wert hs a photograph of Joseph Atkison. Harriet Janes-Slack-Atkison is buried on the hill where the Starr cemetery is, near the village of Btarr.tih~has a monument. Margaret Atkison, wife of Charles Lawton Woodard. and later who married Rev.Wooley, is buried in the Middle Creek cemetery near Grover Hill.

Thomas Atkison and wife are buried in the Middle Creek Cemetery. Exean (Annie) Atkison, wife of Joseph Goodwin, are buried at the Middle Creek Cemetery near Grover Hill, Ohio.

Harriet Slack's son, Abram was born in 1831 and died at or near Cog Hill, Tennessee at the age of 79 years, in March in 1936. He had no children, but had been married twice. He was a fine man and a country physician. Was a veteran of the Civil war in the Confederate Army of Tennessee Infantry. He is buried in the Carlock Cemetery.

The second son, Henry, was born about 1833, died in south eastern Tennessee, was a farmer and soldier of the Civil War. Little is known of him, but he came to see his mother here in Ohio and she was spinning looked up and saw him coming and said " there comes my son Henry."

The youngest son, John was born in Dec 19, 1835 near Ahens, Tennessee soon after the family had reached there from Fauquier County Va. Oct.13, 1900. Lived near Johnson City, Tennessee. He was a newspaper publisher and his son was a State Representative.
