Briefly, Five IRISH BOYLES Brothers entered Baltimore, Maryland harbor from Ireland in 1701.William BOYLES born in Pa. in 1730 moved with his three sons (Wm., John & Dyles) to North Carolina. They settled in what is now Surry & Stokes Counties.

Thirty eight years later, Two other IRISH BOYLES Brothers (William born

 $1720~\rm Ire.~\& amp;$ Charles born $1722~\rm Ire.)$ arrived in about 1740 in the Virginia Colony. Charles moved west and had a large family in what is today West Virginia.

William born 1720 Ire. settled in southern Virginia and had four sons: Wm. & Darnes word to North Caroina and Joseph & Darnes word to Tenneesee.

William BOYLES born about 1740 Va. moved to Rowan County, NC about 1760

and had a son

Rev. John BOYLES who married Margaret (born in SC) about 1788 and moved to Rutherford County, NC (which is today Lincoln County) Rev. John
