

 The Governor of Virginia, from 1837-40, His Excellency David Campbell, b. 7 Aug 1779, was the son of John, b. 20 Apr 1742 (who married Elizabeth McDonald, b. 1753); and grandson of David "White David" b. 8 Mar 1705 in Londonderry, Ulster, N. Ireland, (who married Mary Hamilton, b. 1716).

And Gov. Campbell's wife, Mary Hamilton Campbell (maiden name), was the daughter of Col. David Campbell, b. 2 June 1753, (who married Margaret Campbell, b. 1748); and granddaughter of David "Black David" b. 1710 (who married Jane Cunningham, b. 1718).

So the granddaughter of Black David married the grandson of White David Campbell. Who says opposites don't attract? Both White and Black David lines of Campbells have produced many distinguished public servants.
