1787 Michael received a tract of land in Bethlehem Twp. called Blackberry. During the Revolution he was a Frontier Ranger under Captain Abner Howell. This was in the 3rd Battalion, Washington County.

Emigration: (1800) to Boardman, Ohio

1809-1830 Resided in Howland Twp., Mahoning Co., Ohio

He was shot during the Narragansett War. At the time of his death in 1839 his descendants numbered 485, 16 of whom were in the 4th generation.
