James Ibrey Gaw, 90, the oldest resident of the Third District, Hilham, with one exception, died at his home on Tuesday after an illness of five days with flu. His wife died on January 23, at which time Mr. Gaw appeared to be in his usual good health.

He was a native of the third district, but left there when quite a young man and was in Illinois at the beginning of the Civil War, and enlised in the Federal army. He served through the war, and remained in the North until thirty years ago, when he returned to the place of his birth and childhood to spend the remainder of his days.

He was twice married, his second wife was a Mrs. Hicks, (this being Martha Maxwell Gaw) daughter of James and Mary Lynn Maxwell, to this union were born two sons, Warren and Debs Gaw.

The deceased was the eldest son of Thomas and Elanda Fisk Gaw, his mother being a daughter of the late Moses Fisk, who was the founder of Hilham, and who was the foremost educator of the state in his day.

Funeral and burial were at Maxwell Chapel, two miles west of Hilham, Wednesday morning.
