

Henry Doering was born October 9, 1840, in Schwarzenberg, Melsungen, Germany. The deceased came to America with his parents when he was 13 years of age. At the breaking out of the rebellion he enlisted at the age of 21 in the 43d O. V. I., for a period of three years, he continued in the service until the end of the war, taking part in the noted battles of New Madrid, Iuka, Corinth, Decatur, Resaca and Kenesaw Mt., and was wounded while on duty in the battle of Kenesaw Mt., June 14, 1864. After his sick leave he was transferred to Co. A. 5th Regiment Veteran Reserve Corps, Feb. 18, 1865. The deceased was married Jan 29, 1864, to Miss Catherine Horn, to which union ten children, five boys and five girls have been born, eight of whom still survive, two having died in childhood. He was baptised Oct 26, 1840, was catechised by Rev. Gast, the Lutheran pastor at Tarlton in earlier years and received as a member of Trinity Church at Marcy, May 27, 1896. He died May 30, 1896, aged 55 years, 7 months and 21 days. He leaves to mourn his death a beloved wife, eight children, a step-mother, one brother, three half sisters and a host of friends.
