

Peter Dix was a witness to the "Will of John Worthington, of the Parish of Cheadle,

England", will dated 16 January 1684. John Worthington wrote his will aboard the

ship "Friendship of Liverpool." John Worthington died at sea, 17th of the 11th mo.

1684 (17 January 1684 - Quaker dating). His will was probated 8th of 11th mo.

1685 (8 Jan 1685), Bucks County, Pennsylvania.

Peter Dix/Dicks was definitely on this ship in 1684, but it is not known if wife Esther and daughters, Hannah and Elizabeth accompanied on this trip.

Elizabeth was born sometime in 1684 and would have been quite young. The three month long journey would have been very hard on an infant, for it was difficult

enough for an adult. It is known that by 1786, Peter, Esther and children were well

established in Chester County, Pennsylvania, according to the "History of Chester County Pennsylvania"
