William for the natural love and affection which he has for his children and also for their better maintenance, support, livelihood and prosperity, has granted his children about 200 acres of Caroline County land, being part of the tract on which the said William Burrus now lives, bounded by John Hampton, Pole Cat Creek, John Petiss, John Holmes, James Terrell. Also, the following slaves, Peter, Lucy and ... to Jacob Burrus; Phebe, John and Andrew, and one bed and furnature to [Davi]d Burrus; Kesiah, Abraham and Anderson to Martha Reynolds; Esther, Chloe and _____ and one bed and furnature to [probably Harris] Burris; Hannah, Phillis and Killie and 1 bed and furnature to William Burrus; Bell, Caroline and Benjamin and a bed and furnature to Pleasant Burrus. Daniel and China, and a bed and furnature to Susanna Burrus, together with a grey filly. Signed: William Burrus. Wit: Henry Chiles, James Jones, Samuel Chiles and Nathan Ainsion.
